The kit given contains 2reusable masks (one branded),5 disposable masks, One hand sanitizer and information about COVID-19 and related resources.

Due to the Covid Pandemic, class work was affected severely. Normalcy is being restored allowing students for examinations and to attend class work in a phased manner, duly following Covid Protocols. Thermal Scanning and sanitation at the Main Gate along with Mandatory mask, students are allowed. With the view to in still confidence among them, the NSS unit of the institution has requested the District Covid Control Centre to organize Covid Tests to all the needy ones. Urban Primary Health Centre officials have visited the campus and organized the camp for 4 days.

The students of RISE underwent the COVID test from 19th to 22nd December, 2020. NSS room is arranged as the base for the camp. Over 1200 members underwent the COVID test among which 550 students are from RISE Krishna Sai Gandhi Group of Institutions, remaining being from the nearby villages.

It can be recalled that the government of Andhra Pradesh has made it mandatory for students to have COVID negative reports to attend class offline. Accordingly, the RISE management organized this camp to make sure that everyone is free of COVID. All the staff have also undergone COVID test and all of them are tested negative in a similar camp Conducted on 2-3 November 2020.

Outcome of the Event:

- Conducting COVID tests identifies and isolates infected individuals, preventing further transmission.
- Widespread COVID testing leads to early detection and timely treatment, reducing the severity of cases.
- Increased testing contributes to data accuracy, allowing for better public health decision-making during the pandemic.

Songs and Cultural programs organized by Mr. Rajesh and his team RANGAM organization have got good applause. The session came to an end with the vote of thanks by the principal Dr. K.V. SUBRAMANYAM Garu, Students paid attention to this event and take note of the briefings given by the guests. They expressed happiness and said that these kinds of programme are required and they took oath not to get lured to these evils.
